With the new year has come the start of a multi-million-pound scheme to improve Brierley Hill High Street, making it a better place to live, work and shop.

This £5 million regeneration of the town is set to improve transport links and the look and feel of the area.

It is something local people and businesses have told us they wanted and I'm delighted work is now underway. Such major improvements don't come without some disruption, so please do continue to support your local traders and shop local.

More than £4 million spent on road repairs

More than £4 million has been spent on resurfacing roads in the borough since April last year.

Dudley Council's highways team has carried out work on around 16 miles of road, the latest figures up to the end of January show.

They include part of Birmingham New Road, Flood Street island, Delph Road in Brierley Hill, Pensnett Road and Kidderminster Road in Wall Heath.

The team carried out work on 42 different roads from April to October, with £2.5 million spent on reconstructing roads and a further £240,000 on thin surfacing repairs.

Nearly seven miles of roads were completely reconstructed, with just over one-and-a-half miles getting thin surfacing repairs.

Councillor Shaz Saleem, cabinet member for highways and public realm, said:

"I am delighted to see such positive progress has been made on our road resurfacing programme.

"Potholes are right up there as one of the things we receive most complaints about as a council.

"We are a listening authority and that is why we have allocated millions of pounds from our budget to repair those roads most in need."

You now need Photo ID to Vote at a Polling station

The new national legislation applies across the country, including for the local elections in Dudley on May 4.

Accepted forms of ID include:

- a UK, European Economic Area (EEA) or Commonwealth passport
- a UK, EEA or Commonwealth driving licence
- some concessionary travel passes

Voters will be able to use expired ID if they are still recognisable from the photo.

Anyone who does not have one of the accepted forms of ID can still vote, you just need to apply for a free 'voter authority certificate'.

The full list of accepted ID is available on the Electoral Commission's website, along with more information about the new requirement and details of how to apply for the free ID.

The deadline to register is April 25.

There are details on the QR codes below.

Kevin O'Keefe, Dudley Council chief executive and elections returning officer, said:

"The elections are fast approaching and people should take the time to make sure they have everything they need.

"You will need one of the approved forms of photo ID, or apply for the voter authority certificate, to ensure you can still have your say at the polls. "There's lots of options for people, including registering for a postal vote. It's just about being prepared.

"If anyone needs any help with applying for the free ID, or wants to request an application form, contact the electoral services team."

The new requirement to show photo ID at the polling station was introduced by the UK Government's Elections Act, which was passed last year and comes into effect for the first time this May.

The voter authority certificate is only needed if people do not have an approved photo ID. It's quick and easy to do online, use the QR code below.

Register to vote

Anyone who wants to have their say in the local elections this May must be registered to vote.

The elections take place on May 4.

If you want to vote, you have until April 17 to register.

But voters need to remember you need photo ID or a voter authority certificate if you want to cast your vote in person.

Once registered, you can request a postal vote by 5pm on April 18 or a proxy vote by 5pm on April 25.

Electoral boundary review

Residents are invited to have their say on a review of electoral ward boundaries across the borough.

The Local Government Boundary Commission, the independent body which draws these boundaries, is running a consultation and is asking for comments.

The commission is recommending there continues to be 72 ward councillors in the borough, but is reviewing where the ward boundaries should be drawn.

Its review aims to make sure councillors represent about the same number of electors, as well as ensure its proposals reflect community ties and identities.

The consultation closes on March 15 and, after considering responses, the commission will publish draft recommendations in May. There will then be a further period of consultation before final recommendations are published in October.

The new electoral arrangements will come into effect at the local elections in May 2024.

Regenerating Brierley Hill town centre

The multi-million-pound regeneration of Brierley Hill town centre is underway, with work set to improve transport links and the look and feel of the area.

The £5 million scheme includes the refurbishment of Brierley Hill Library and upgraded public toilets, as well as new cycle facilities. New seating, plants and trees will be installed along the High Street, while the areas around the Brier Rose sculpture, the locally listed drinking fountain and St Mary's Church will also be revamped.

Councillor David Stanley, cabinet member for regeneration and enterprise, said:

"These refurbishments and upgrades will make Brierley Hill a better place to live, work and shop. The demand for improvements has been clear from both residents and businesses and I am delighted work is getting underway to meet their needs.

"We are committed to minimising disruption during these improvements and have consulted closely with the local community throughout the planning process."

During the work:

- a one-way system towards Dudley is in place on the High Street, running from the junction with Venture Way to the junction with Bank Street
- traffic diversions are also in place, with no access to Cottage Street from the High Street

The project, which is funded through the Future High Street Fund and Brierley Hill High Street Heritage Action Zone (HAZ), is due to be completed in spring 2024.

Shop local urge traders

During the work, traders in Brierley Hill are urging people to continue to 'shop locally.'

While the multi-million-pound work will lead to major improvements, traders say in the short term they rely on people coming into the town to shop in the market place and other businesses.

Tracy Lowe who runs Memories card stall on the market, pictured with fellow traders below, said:

"We understand the importance of the improvements being made but they are having an impact on local businesses.

"We want to remind people we are all open for business. It's really important people continue to shop locally, especially given the interruptions of the roadworks but also after a difficult few years.

"There's everything you can think of on sale on the market and I'd urge people to come down and have a look for themselves."

The market, offering a range of goods across 35 stalls, is open 9am to 3pm, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday. There's two-hours free parking on all council carparks in the town.



Council tax discounts and reductions

The council is encouraging people to find out if they can get a reduction in their council tax.

- people who live alone could be eligible for a 25% discount off their council tax
- a reduction may also be due where all, or all but one, of those usually living there are students, severely mentally impaired, carers, apprentices or long-term hospital/care home patients
- help is available if someone with a disability lives in the property and needs an additional bathroom, kitchen or other room, or uses a wheelchair indoors
- special arrangements are in place to support care leavers (aged 18 to 24)
- the council tax reduction scheme can reduce the amount of council tax that low-income households, including those receiving universal credit have to pay

In addition, help with rent payments may be available via discretionary housing payments. To be considered for this, residents need to be in receipt of housing benefit or the housing element of universal credit.

Dudley's pop-up tip could soon be fortnightly

The pop-up tip in Dudley could soon be fortnightly after an overwhelmingly positive response since its launch in October.

Based on the car park opposite the Lister Road depot, the pop-up tip, which currently operates on the third Saturday of each month, could soon be twice a month, subject to full council approval.

The move will increase capacity at the facility and contribute to the overall goal of reaching Net Zero greenhouse gas emissions in Dudley borough.

Bookings for the site must be made in advance using the quick and easy online system on the council's website.

Residents are reminded to cancel their booking if they no longer intend to visit, to free up capacity for other users.

Items which can be disposed of include green waste, wood, scrap metal, small electrical items, residual waste, bricks, rubble, plasterboard, household waste, mattresses, furniture and general recycling.

Oils, car batteries and hazardous waste cannot be accepted.

Street party fees waived for Coronation

Road closure fees have been waived for residents wanting to celebrate the King's Coronation with a street party - with the deadline for applications, March 10.

The Coronation of King Charles III is on Saturday May 6 at Westminster Abbey, followed by an extra bank holiday on Monday May 8 when Dudley borough residents will be joining people from across the country for The Big Lunch to celebrate together.

The Mayor of Dudley will also be providing a limited number of coronation party packs for street parties. These will be allocated on a first come, first served basis once an application has been approved.

Renewed call for sites

There's a renewed call for brownfields sites as part of the council's commitment to produce its own Local Plan.

At January's cabinet meeting, members approved the timescales to prepare the plan, which includes a renewed call for brownfield sites. The plan is being developed after the council withdrew from the Black Country Plan last year. The Dudley Local Plan will focus on housing and employment needs, which will inform developments and planning decisions in the future, while also reflecting local people's views on the use of greenbelt land.

The decision to withdraw from the Black Country Plan coincides with the government's proposed legislation to give local people a bigger say on developments in their towns.

The proposed legislation, currently open for consultation, reemphasises the requirement to focus on brownfield land for housing development and makes it clear councils are under no obligation to review greenbelt for potential housing use.

Councillor Patrick Harley, leader of Dudley Council, said:

"We're developing our own plan, which will make it crystal clear our priority will always be brownfield first when looking for land to redevelop.

"Our renewed call out for sites is to ensure we have left no stone unturned when looking for brownfield land that could fulfil housing or employment needs."

The renewed call for brownfield sites was due to launch in early February. Landowners and agents are encouraged not to submit the same sites again as they have already been assessed.

Those sites which are considered as being suitable for development will be included in the Draft Dudley Plan which will be published for a six-week public consultation over the summer.







Welcome to the spring edition of Home Affairs!

We know some of our residents are experiencing increased living costs and I want to reassure you that the housing services teams are here to help.

Paying rent should always be a priority, but if there is a change in circumstances or your usual rent payment cannot be made, please contact the income team immediately for support and advice. More details of the help available can be found in this issue of Home Affairs.

If you're considering downsizing, we have an article about how our teams can provide lots of helpful information, advice and support. We also have exciting news about our independent living schemes, which provide modern facilities at affordable rents for individuals and couples aged 55 and over across the borough, with some currently undergoing extensive renovation works.

The participation team works closely with the Dudley Federation of Tenants and Residents Associations (TRAs) and I'd like to thank those of you who take part. We've also helped to set up the Dudley Housing Board, where volunteer board members meet regularly with councillors and officers to discuss housing service performance and possible improvements. If you would like to get involved with the board or find out if there's a TRA in your area, you can contact the participation team.

April rent increase

By now you should have received your annual rent letter, which was distributed in February.

This letter informed you that rents for council homes will increase from April 2023. It states what your revised rent will be and includes any additional sundry charges.

If you receive housing benefit or universal credit, your benefit payments will generally be adjusted to reflect the higher rent. For housing benefit this will automatically be adjusted, but for universal credit you will need to update your rent details using your online journal.

Universal credit claimants will receive a 'confirm your housing costs to-do' message on their journal. Please use this 'to-do' option but do not update your claim before 3 April 2023 and do not use the 'change of circumstances to-do' to report your rent change.

All income from rents is invested in the maintenance, improvement and management of council homes.

You can monitor your rent balance through our new and improved online rent account service, eHousing. This service is available 24/7 and allows you to make payments, view your balance and update your contact details.

DUDLEY HOUSING BOARD


The board is a group of volunteers who meet every quarter with councillors and officers to look at how our housing service is performing and to discuss possible improvements and investment opportunities for the future.

As a board member, there is an expected duty to act in the best interest of tenants, residents, leaseholders and customers. The collective benefit is to improve decision making, provide challenge and to ensure that high quality services and best value for money are delivered.

Board members serve a term of three years, which can be extended subject to an assessment of performance in the role.

REMEMBER... paying your rent is a priority

It's a tough time for many at the moment, but you must remember paying your rent is a priority.

If you have a change in circumstances or find you are unable to make your usual rent payment, you should contact the income team immediately on 0300 555 0010.

When you contact the income team, staff can:

- · discuss a payment plan with you
- offer advice about claiming additional benefits
- tell you about other available funding

As an authority we try to make it as easy as possible for you to pay your rent. As part of your tenancy conditions you must ensure payments are made on time and for the correct amount.

Evictions are a last resort, but they do happen, and as most tenants pay their rent on time it is only right that Dudley Council takes the strongest possible action against those who do not.

Remember - if you are unable to pay your rent, contact the income team to discuss the situation on 0300 555 0010.

Downsizing

Living in one of our schemes, you are part of a community where you can build friendships and help prevent isolation.

New unpaid carers support hub in Halesowen

A new hub offering free information, advice and support to people who provide unpaid care and support to family or friends has opened in Halesowen.

The support hub at the Brett Young Centre on Old Hawne is the second of its kind run by the council's Dudley Carers Hub and Wellbeing Service - the other is at the Queens Cross Network, Wellington Road, Dudley.

The hubs can help with information on financial and legal issues, advice on social care and health services, emotional support and provide opportunities to meet others through social and carers groups.

Councillor Natalie Neale, cabinet member for adult social care, said:

"It's been fantastic opening a second centre for our local carers and to be providing much needed support and advice.

"Many people who provide care often don't see themselves as a carer and so are not aware of the support and help available to them. That is why these hubs are so important and I would urge anyone caring for a family member or a friend to get in touch and see how we can help."

Dudley remembers the Holocaust in moving ceremony

Dudley borough came together to remember the atrocities of the Holocaust in an emotional commemoration event at Dudley College.

The Mayor of Dudley, Councillor Sue Greenaway, joined local faith leaders to light a candle of remembrance for the millions of people who were killed and persecuted during the Holocaust, before planting a tree in Coronation Gardens to mark the 80th anniversary of the Association of Jewish Refugees.

A keynote speech was given by concentration camp survivor Eva Clarke BEM. Mrs Clarke was born on a cart outside the Mauthausen camp in April 1945 after her pregnant mother was sent on a horrific three-week journey via coal truck. Fifteen members of her family lost their lives in the Holocaust.

Mrs Clarke later joined the Mayor of Dudley, Association of Jewish Refugees chief executive Michael Newman OBE, Lord Lieutenant Sir John Crabtree CBE, and pupils from St Thomas's School to plant the tree, which was the final planting of the AJR's 80 Trees for 80 Years project.

The native oak tree symbolises the contribution of Jewish refugees to life in Britain. Dudley was selected as the final site for planting due to the borough's long history of welcoming refugees of many different faiths and nationalities.

Councillor Sue Greenaway, the Mayor of Dudley, said:

"The commemoration was an immensely moving event and I was honoured to light the candle of remembrance and plant the memorial tree."


