Food Insecure Youth Organization

All Kids Win

The nonprofit organization All Kids Win has a mission to assist local homeless students/youth whom often go hungry outside of their school provided meals. This means that on weekends and on breaks from school, these students don't have the nourishment that is critically important to their growth and development. At the end of the 2022 school year, All Kids Win were serving over 600 students, at 55 schools per week, by providing a bag of food to students for the weekend. By utilizing school counselors to deliver the bags of food, there's an opportunity for additional check-in with students.

Master Gardener Foundation Thurston County

The Washington State University Master Gardeners of Thurston County is a volunteer service program. There is a perception that to become a WSU Master Gardener you must know everything about gardening. This is unrealistic and untrue. To be a WSU Thurston County Master Gardener you must have gardening experience, but more importantly you must have the commitment to be a lifelong learner and sharer of information. This program offers gardeners' opportunities to gain personal gardening knowledge but their primary focus is to develop community educators. Once trained, WSU Master Gardener volunteers help deliver messages to the citizens of Thurston County related to water-wise gardening, how to grow your own food, low-impact landscaping, diagnosing plant diseases, identifying insects/pests etc. We provide a number of different venues, including demonstration gardens, community booths and question/answer clinics through which volunteers deliver these messages. The organization held weekly Plant Sales during the season, typically open to the public on Wednesdays. The station is proud to support this important organization.

Their facility serves as a community hub for local artists and can host music events and other meetups. The station provided PSAs asking listeners to help support Olympia Lamplighters, as they work to relocate the shared workspace to a new facility which requires covering moving and construction costs, to continue serving local artists.

15. Long-Form Content Building Industry

On-Air Interview Content

The station partners with local architectural designer, Kevin Arnold who invites special guests into the studio with Kevin Huffer, for a long-form interview discussing interesting content related to the local building industry. The long interview is split into 3–4-minute segments, which air on Thursdays throughout the 1pm hour, the objective is to entertain and inform listeners who are interested in DYI home projects, professional home improvement projects, or simply interested in learning more about the building industry. For example, while not every show will talk about housing challenges in Thurston County and the Puget Sound region, the weekly discussion points out how increased regulations, fees, and zoning limitations play a role in today's expensive, unaffordable, and unavailable housing working families are experiencing. Between launching the program in August, until the end of September, eight total guest interviews were aired by the station, representing a diversity of content among the building industry.
