10	(1)	In order for a veterinarian to practice veterinary medicine, a relationship among the				
11		vete	rinarian, the client, and the patient shall be established and maintained.			
12		"Vet	terinarian-client-patient relationship" means that:			
13		(a)	The veterinarian has assumed the responsibility for making judgments			
14			regarding the health of the animal and the need for veterinary treatment, and			
15			the client, whether owner or other caretaker, has agreed to follow the			
16			instructions of the veterinarian;			
17		(b)	There is sufficient knowledge of the animal by the veterinarian to initiate at			
18			least a general or preliminary diagnosis of the medical condition of the animal.			
19			This means that the veterinarian has recently seen and is personally acquainted			
20			with the keeping and care of the animal by virtue of an examination of the			
21			animal or by medically appropriate and timely visits to the premises where the			
22			animal is kept; and			
23		(c)	The practicing veterinarian is readily available or shall provide medical			
24			service for follow-up in case of adverse reactions or failure of the regimen of			
25			therapy. A new regimen of therapy shall be contingent only upon cooperation			
26			of the client and availability of the subject animal.

2	(3)	(a)	A veterinarian shall not violate the confidential relationship between the
3			veterinarian and the veterinarian's client.
4		(b)	A veterinarian shall not release information concerning a client or care of a
5			client's animal, except[on the veterinarian's receipt of]:
6			1. On the veterinarian's receipt of:
7			<u>a.</u> A written authorization or other form of waiver executed by the
8			client; or
9			<u>b.[2.]</u> An appropriate court order or subpoena; or
10			2. In cases of known animal abuse, pursuant to Section 1 of this Act.
11		(c)	A veterinarian who releases information under paragraph (b) of this
12			subsection shall not be liable to any person, including the client, for an action
13			resulting from the disclosure.
14		(d)	The privilege provided by this subsection is waived by the client or the owner
15			of an animal treated by the veterinarian to the extent the client or owner places
16			at issue in a civil or criminal proceeding:
17			1. The nature and extent of the animal's injuries; or
18			2. The care and treatment of the animal provided by the veterinarian.
19		(e)	This subsection shall not apply to:
20			1. An inspection or investigation conducted by the board or an agent of the
21			board; or
22			2. The veterinary reporting requirements and regulatory authority of the
23			Kentucky Horse Racing Commission to inspect, investigate, and
24			supervise horses and other participants in horse racing as provided by
25			KRS Chapter 230 and the administrative regulations promulgated under
26			KRS Chapter 230, or any other law applicable to the regulation of horse

racing in the Commonwealth.
