

GUY JAMES “JIM” FULTON

Jim Fulton was born in Quercus Grove, Indiana on November 21, 1940 to Guy Jacob and Marie Frances (Wilson) Fulton. His dad served with the Army Air Corps during World War II.

Jim attended just about all the local schools in the Lawrenceburg area. He went to the Newtown Grade School from grades 1-4, Homestead School grades 5-6, Central School for grade 7 and Greendale for grade 8. He only missed St. Lawrence. He graduated from Lawrenceburg Consolidated High School (LCHS) in 1958. Jim attended several colleges including: University of Wyoming, University of Maryland, Indiana University and Harvard. Jim entered the United States Air Force in 1958 and went to Lackland Air Force Base in Texas and then completed his four year enlistment in 1962 and left the service. He served in the Reserves for three years. He returned in 1965 after a break of 3 years and 8 months and completed a total of 21 years of active duty and retired as a Master Sergeant in February of 1983 with a total of 24 years of service. He had a very distinguished career and led to him serving primarily in Military Command Centers and he managed the Console Operations at the Strategic Air Command (SAC) at the Underground Command Center near Omaha, Nebraska. He served as an Emergency Actions Controller in MAJCOM Command Centers.

Jim is a proud Vietnam Veteran and served with the famous 366 Tactical Flight Wing (the Gunfighters) at DaNang in

1967-68, including the Tet Offensive which started in late January of 1968.

Jim has so many medals, citations and awards but some of them are: the Meritorious Service Medal, Vietnam Service Medal, Vietnam Campaign Medal, Air Force Good Conduct Medal, Vietnamese Gallantry Cross with Palm and many more. Jim served almost 12 years of his 21 years overseas. Some of his duty was at: Goose Bay Labrador; Korea; Minot, North Dakota; Ramstein, Germany; Grand Forks, North Dakota and Yakota, Japan.

Jim and his wife, Sam, were married on November 17, 1990. Jim has one son, Guy James Fulton II, who is an ordained Orthodox Priest at Cooperstown, New York. His church name is Father Ignatius.

Jim is a member of several historical societies and makes many appearances and dresses up and performs as Abraham Lincoln. It is remarkable to see him like this.

Jim is a life member of the Southeastern Indiana Vietnam Veterans of America, Larry D. Fogle Chapter 71, American Legion and Sons of the American Revolution.

Jim is one of the founders of the Emergency Services Integrators (ESI) and has over forty years of experience in the design, development, operation and management of complex command, control and emergency facilities around the world. He was employed by Westinghouse from 1985-96 as a Computer Security Manager, Telecommunications Manager and Emergency Operations Manager. In 1994, Westinghouse & the Department of Energy offered Jim the opportunity to “spin out” his own company and was sent to the Harvard

School of Business majoring in Entrepreneurship. Within five years ESI emerged as an industry leader in the field of 9-1-1 Center & Emergency Operations Center design. Jim was the founder, CEO, Chief Design Engineer and President of the company. He sold the company in 2012 and today the Crisis Information Management Software continues to be the Global Leader. It is used in 45 states, including Indiana, and every major federal agency responsible for Emergency Management and homeland Defense.

Jim and his wife, Sam, reside in the beautiful Greyhound Mansion in Greendale with their “Rescue Greyhounds”. It is a remarkable and beautiful home they purchased after moving from Breckenridge, Colorado and did a complete historical restoration over a three year period, starting in 2017.
