WHY NOW?

- Grant funding is a long-lead item requiring preparedness
- FEMA Region 5 has re-initiated an update for the “Analysis and Mapping Plan for Lawrenceburg/Greendale (LAMP) Project”
- Final design and construction might not be funded / completed in time for the accreditation process.
- Major economic impacts for Dearborn County and potential risk to assets and quality of life in Lawrenceburg and Greendale if not funded
- Garner letters of support from community members.

GRANT REQUIREMENTS



Multiple funding sources are available, all with different specific requirements. Each type of funding opportunity has:



- A specific schedule with it that is non-negotiable



- Different requirements to meet to be competitive for the program



- Some level of environmental documentation requirement



- A 'local' match designation required in advance of the grant application submission that is typically 25% and greater

LOCAL MATCH REQUIREMENTS

- At the time of application submission, all ‘local dollars’ must be accounted for and confirmed.
 - Binding resolution explicitly stating the dollars are set aside for this project - preferred
 - Budget Line Item noting the set-aside - preferred

LOCAL MATCH REQUIREMENTS

- Non-Binding Resolution defined:

*A Non-binding resolution is a motion adopted by a deliberative body that does not enact a law or a substantive rule and is **simply used to make known what the opinions of that body are in relation to a certain fact or event.***

This type of resolution is often used to express the body's approval or disapproval of something that they cannot otherwise vote on, due to the matter being handled by another jurisdiction, or being protected by a constitution.

LOCAL MATCH REQUIREMENTS

- REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

- Financial commitment for all local funds for 25% (or more) of the project costs
 - Binding Resolution from all entities contributing to the local match

OTHER FUNDING SOURCES

US ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS (USACE)

- Met with USACE on March 28, 2025 (pre-FEMA press release)
 - Recommended BRIC as best funding source for this effort
 - Acknowledged USACE funds can only be used on USACE projects
 - Recommends to project teams to look outside USACE for funding opportunities
 - Discussed Silver Jackets program as an engagement resource, not for funding
 - Stated that the Water Resources Development Act (WRDA) is for pumps/pumping stations only and funding availability is several years out.

CURRENT STATUS OF GRANT FUNDING

- BRIC GRANT
 - Previously identified BRIC grant as primary option for full funding under one program
 - BRIC Grant was cancelled through an Executive Order on April 4, 2025
- ADDITIONAL GRANT OPPORTUNITIES
 - Ongoing research as grant programs are being refined.
 - Most robust grant programs require a 25% local match

The project need and cost remains regardless of grant program status.

GRANT REQUIREMENTS

- HAZARD MITIGATION

Consistent with the Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) for Pre-Disaster Mitigation (PDM) grants, is the proposed activity consistent with the goals and objectives in both the state or tribal hazard mitigation plan (44 CFR Part 201) and the local hazard mitigation plan of the jurisdiction in which the project is located.

NEXT STEPS

Many grant programs traditionally have a short period of time to apply.
It is imperative that grant requirements are completed to maximize funding potential.
