

A day to remember with RUSSELL WATSON

When I headed to London's Wisebuddah Studio in 2010, I could barely wait to meet Russell Watson. I'd seen him reveal his remarkable story of how he escaped death following horrendous brain tumours and I'd read his emotional book.

was not keen to make the interview a sob story. Russell gave me such a warm welcome and we hit it off instantly. He was also pleased to see his interviewer. The thrill for me is always meeting my guests. Virtually the rest of the day he had spent chatting to various radio stations all over Britain via headphones and high quality telephone lines.

He looked so well and yet I knew he didn't expect to make it. He was recording an album at the time of his first illness but had not told anyone of his condition. His vision had almost gone. In his own mind he had created his last piece of music.

Thankfully, there was a happy ending. He recovered, after a great fight, and the album was released as That's Life.

The very night before our interview he had been presented with the award for the Best Classical Artist for 2010.

At the time he was promoting his latest album, La Voce, recorded in Italy with members of the famed Ennio Morricone Orchestra. Right on cue Russell added a few bars of a Clint Eastwood theme.

How did his music career start? He was another who sat in a bedroom with a mate playing along to Beatles records.

I quickly sensed Russell was prone to teasing and this is always a good sign. I got into the spirit of it all and asked him how many exams he passed when he left school.

With a great laugh he said: "John I think the word you are looking for is none."

His father once told him:" It's just as well you can sing. You can't do

much else lad." Before leaving school he would wash cars and had several paper rounds and was keen to make his own way in life. He began on a youth opportunity programme and received £27 a week. Then he worked in a bolt cutting factory.

Be was another who sat in a bedroom with a mate playing along to Beatles records

Eventually he became a mimic in pubs before moving into the tough world of northern clubs. Usually it was just before the bingo. There were times when he thought he would never move beyond club land.

On one occasion he was billed as: "Russell Watson — Salford's Joe Longthorne. Everything from Pavarotti to Meatloaf."

One night at the Wigan Road Working Men's Club was to change his life. A guy called Sidney said to him: "Russell Watson you have a great voice you ought to sing some of that opera stuff. Pavarotti's 'Neston Doormat' would be perfect for you." That old boy was spot on.

Suddenly his career took off and before long he was selling millions of albums. He sang at a Champions League Final, performed for the Pope in the Vatican and even won the male rear of the year title.

Russell has always been dubbed the People's Tenor. In reality, he introduced so many working class people to the world of opera. That was always his ambition from early in his singing career.

I once interviewed an opera singer who described Russell as just being a karaoke singer. In fact, she was not very famous at all. A little touch of envy, maybe.

Our so-called karaoke singer has sung with the Boston Pops Orchestra, the Royal Philharmonic and BBC Concert Orchestra. His voice has thrilled millions all around the world.

Currently Russell is touring Britain in his rescheduled 20th Anniversary tour which, lockdown permitting will carry on well into 2022. His latest album is called 20.

I was lucky enough to interview Russell on two other occasions and he is always a joy to be with. A real credit to his business.

Mind you, I rarely mention his beloved Manchester United. You can hear too much of a good thing! ⁽³⁾

The doors will open an hour before the talk begins so you can have a very quiet, personal walk around the sanctuary and enjoy a complimentary hot drink and slice of cake at a gentle pace.

Tim is a captivating speaker with a rich knowledge of Isle of Wight military history, and he will host a guided tour around the Granite Fort together with a fascinating talk about this very special site.

The story begins in the mid-19th Century,

when Sandown's Granite Fort was built by Lord Palmerston's Government to protect the bay against a French invasion that never came. The many forts across the Island soon became known as Palmerston's Folly. But Tim will tell you that the forts had other vital purposes. The story will continue through to the Granite Fort's near destruction in the 1930s, and of course its vital role as a pumping station in one of the Second World War's most audacious engineering projects, the Pipe Line Under The Ocean – PLUTO.



Tim's talent for story-telling will bring history to life and shine a light on Sandown's story that many will be unaware of. Did you know Sandown even had its own Nazi spy, local landlady Mrs Dorothy O'Grady!

In 1940, when Britain stood alone, our little town on the bay would play a vital role in the conflict. When the

invasion came, the bay would have become a brutal battlefield, and the defences that were deployed across the beach and bay are in themselves an incredible story. Winston Churchill's famous speech: "We will fight them on the beaches" would have been very close to home.

The Sanctuary will open its doors at 5pm,

so you can see the rescued animals before a prompt 6pm start to the talk in the Wildheart Café, before a leisurely guided tour of the site.





Elevate the humble wrap into a sensational taste-bud tingling experience. Adele Trathan recommends this very grown-up version of a fish wrap that's certain to impress any lunchtime guests.

INGREDIENTS

4 salmon fillets 4 whole wheat tortilla wraps 2 large ripe avocados (stoned and peeled) 1 tsp smoked paprika 1 tbsp olive oil Pinch of salt and freshly ground black pepper

FOR THE SALSA VERDE

2 cloves garlic
1 bunch of fresh flat-leaf parsley
½ bunch of fresh basil
10-12 sprigs of fresh mint
1 tbsp capers
2 gherkins, roughly chopped
6 anchovy fillets
1 tbsp Dijon mustard
3 tbsp red wine vinegar
8 tbsp extra virgin olive oil

METHOD

Pre-heat the grill to a medium-high heat. Combine the oil and smoked paprika in a small bowl, adding salt and pepper to season. Coat the salmon evenly with the oil mixture.

2 Mash the avocado flesh with a fork, then season with salt and pepper, plus a dash of extra paprika if an added kick of spice is desired. 3 Place the salmon under the grill, skin side down, and grill for 12-15 minutes until the salmon is cooked and flakes easily with a fork. Transfer the salmon to a chopping board or plate and remove the skin.

4 Put all the ingredients for the Salsa Verde into a tall container. Using a hand blender, whizz up the mixture until the desired consistency is reached, which can range from super smooth to coarse and textured. Add a sprinkle of salt and pepper to taste.

5 Take the wraps and add a layer of mashed avocado to each one, then flake a salmon fillet on each wrap followed by a good drizzle of Salsa Verde. Roll up, serve immediately and accept the compliments from diners. Store any remaining Salsa Verde in the fridge for a few days and use with grilled chicken, fish and salads.





NGREDIENTS


8 fish fingers 4 tortilla wraps 1 Little Gem lettuce or similar 2 ripe tomatoes ½ cucumber ½ red onion or 4 spring onions 2 tbsp mayonnaise 2 tbsp tomato ketchup 1 lemon, quartered

METHOD

Pre-heat the grill to a medium to high heat. Grill the fish fingers, turning occasionally, for 12-15 minutes until crisp and golden.

2 In the meantime, mix the ketchup and mayonnaise together in a bowl. Slice the lettuce, then chop the onion, tomatoes and cucumber into small pieces. 3 Spread a generous amount of the mayonnaise/ketchup mixture on one side of each tortilla wrap. Layer with the lettuce, tomatoes, cucumber and onions then top with two fish fingers.

A Serve with a wedge of lemon for the kids to squeeze. Wrap up, tuck in, then make some more!



100 Years Since **UFFA FOX'S** FOOLHARDY JOURNEY By John Hannam

In 1978 the Duke of Edinburgh said: "In conventional terms Uffa was eccentric." That was never better demonstrated than 100 years ago, when he ended up being sacked as the scoutmaster of Cowes Sea Scouts.

n Saturday July 30, 1921, Uffa and a crew of nine sea scouts set sail for a few days camping trip to the western Solent. Well, that's what the parents thought. Our intrepid helmsman had other ideas but never told anyone. His real aim was to reach Paris in their 27 foot open whaler Valhalla. Incredibly, they got to within 70 kilometres of the city but had to return on Saturday August 6, because some of the young guys were due to be back to work on the Monday — or so they thought.

Amazingly, Uffa took a small camera on the trip and many of the 100 year old photographs still present a unique record of his very mindless trip. He added his own thoughts to the book of photographs. He had personally trained all his crew and had great confidence in them and that they would make it.

Uffa also completed a handwritten log which recorded every detail of the trip. Obviously, they had no paperwork or passports to indentify them in foreign waters. He could always spin a good yarn and he was able to bluff himself and his crew through any embarrassing situations.

The first day proved an eventful start. The tide turned against them off Newtown and at 2pm they landed in Colwell Bay. In the log

Uffa had recorded: "We lay out on the hill like rotten sheep."

They left Colwell at 7.30pm and local Totland lifeboat coxswain Bill Conway told them they would turn back in less than an hour due to a heavy swell off the Needles. Apparently, Uffa was heard to politely tell him to put his head in a bag and pull it tight.

On Monday August 1 at 7.20am Uffa, the only one not sleeping, woke them up to celebrate seeing mainland France. They landed at Le Havre at 12.30pm, 40 hours after leaving the Needles. They changed what money they had, played beach football and then had a good blow out on lemonade and cakes.

Uffa had this to say in his log: "We took them to a grog shop and gave them some cognac. That took their breath away and made them sit up and take notice."

At 8.30pm that night they tied up along the upper side of the La Roque breakwater and enjoyed a meal of spinach and corned beef. Then they turned in. Some slept in a mud hut, others under their sail draped out over a fence but Uffa stayed on board as he was afraid of the bore taking the whaler away.

The next morning they set sail for Rouen. Passing an apple orchard proved a real bonus. They reached a small market village called Duclair and even joined in

some village sports. The whole village turned out to see them off — in almost disbelief.

On Wednesday August 3 they landed in Rouen, where they met a lot of British people. The nights were clear at this period so they slept on board without having to use tents.

Then came a series of locks and sometimes they were lucky to receive tows from friendly barge shippers.

On one occasion they had some great fun. One of the crew had brought what he thought was jam. Then found out it was not easy to spread baby food on bread and butter.

Then came that fateful day of Saturday August 6 when they decided to turn back. They had reached just past Mantes. Luckily, they received a few good tows to help their return to Le Havre. These included The Swallow of Grimsby.

They arrived in Rouen on Monday August 8. They had been expected in Cowes the previous day. Somehow, Uffa managed to bemuse a customs officer who demanded papers and passports. He acted like a very dense Englishman and got away with it. Eventually they left the canal and headed for the Island.

Uffa and his crew actually landed in Ventnor on Wednesday August 10 at 9pm. An eager Ventnor coastguard even thought they had been shipwrecked. Three of the boys then walked to East Cowes as they were already three days late for work. The rest went to a local restaurant for a blow out. They landed at Marvin's Yard, Cowes, on Thursday August 11 at 5pm. Uffa thought his mad cruise had been a great success. Not everyone agreed. The worried parents, in particular.

Uffa, who went on to be a world famous helmsman and boat designer, summed it all up.

"I have been chewed up by Admiral Allenby, the commissioner of sea scouts for the Island and also by the Cowes committee, who had all resigned on account of this cruise. I was relieved of my post as scoutmaster.

"We have a rule that every boat must be examined and a certificate filled up to the effect she is seaworthy etc. Well the whaler was examined and according to her certificate is only seaworthy between Hurst and Bembridge. I was also surveyed and registered A1."

He was asked by a Cowes dentist, who should have known better, if he had intended to go to France and did he carry a compass?

"I refrained from telling him we were heading for Beaulieu but we missed our turning and ended up in the Seine. A compass was not needed — just follow the signposts!"

For the record, the fab ten were Uffa, F Smith, F Bow, H Beverton, C Hookey, H Harvey, R Dickerson, W Waight, S Crews and F Curtis. 3 Uffa thought his mad cruise had been a great success. Not everyone agreed. The worried parents, in particular.

NL CLINIC ISLE OF WIGHT

The NL Clinic Isle of Wight started offering travel related Covid testing services in April of this year. The purpose was clear— offer exceptional service at a very personal level to Islanders without having to leave the Island.

s the name suggests, the NL Clinic Isle of Wight operates from a service centre on the Island itself. From the centre of Newport, the drop-in centre is mid-way down Crocker Street, a few minutes from Hurst. With many parking places close by, the drop-in centre is easily accessible. Alternatively, the Cowes drop-in clinic based at Gurnard Pines Leisure Centre offers additional testing on the weekend.

WHY IS THERE A NEED FOR THE SERVICE?

Travelling abroad has become more complicated

since the pandemic. With both local and international governments fighting to ensure a return to relative normality whilst battling Covid-19, one solution is to test individuals as they cross borders through both mandatory and voluntary requirements.

The mandatory requirements that both the United Kingdom and destination countries place on international travellers are constantly changing. These requirements can be a stressful complication to your holiday planning, but the NL Clinic Isle of Wight aims to remove that stress.

HOW DOES THE NL CLINIC HELP?

By only offering a pre-booked appointment, administered by NL Clinic staff, they are able to ensure the sample is collected properly and prepared for delivery to their government-approved laboratory on the mainland, where samples are processed, and results emailed to clients.

WHAT'S NEXT?

With many clients using NL Clinic Isle of Wight for their outgoing travel, the clinic has developed a system for offering a 'Return to UK – Virtual Overseas Test'.

Once the in-clinic fit-to-fly sample has been collected, a testing kit is handed to the outgoing client, along with access to a dedicated website for a specified time to perform a remote session test from

session test from which a 'Return to UK Certificate' can be emailed to the client.

The NL Clinic has attempted to alleviate some of the complications of fulfilling both mandatory and voluntary testing requirements for travel for those of us on the Island. With a friendly and cooperative approach, they have managed to service the needs of Islanders.



The book costs \pounds 6.99.





Southern Co-op Supports Food Voucher Scheme

Southern Co-op is showing its support for families on the Isle of Wight by topping up the Healthy Start vouchers scheme.

As part of its work to tackle food poverty, Southern Co-op has promised to add $\pounds 1$ to the value of every Healthy Start Voucher which is currently worth $\pounds 4.25$.

Healthy Start vouchers provide additional support for families on lower incomes with children under four or pregnant women in order to access healthy foods. The vouchers can be used for fresh, frozen or tinned fruit and vegetables, fresh, dried or tinned pulses, cow's milk and certain infant formula.

Holly Bramble, Southern Co-op's Community and Campaign Coordinator, said: "Poverty and food inequality are issues that we have been working with our communities to tackle through food donations, our Feed a Family Fund,

and other financial support. But whilst there are children still going hungry, then more needs to be done."

For families who claim two vouchers, this would mean they could get $\pounds 10.50$

per week, or £546 over the year including the top up of £104 a year. For families who get one voucher, this would add up to £273 over 12 months.

Once families have received their vouchers, they simply need to present them at the till when buying any eligible food items at a Southern Co-op store and the value will automatically be topped up to $\pounds 5.25$.

Power Players

Who is involved in making a Power of Attorney?

f you wish to allow friends or family to make decisions for you, should you ever be unable to do so yourself, it is important you consider the need to prepare Lasting Powers of Attorney. Here Glanvilles Damant have explained the key people involved in power and what you will need to think about before deciding who to appoint.

Donor: The person making the power is known as the donor because they are the one 'giving' the power to make decisions either concerning their finances or health and welfare to someone else. The donor can decide when they want the power concerning their finances to take effect, i.e. straight away even when they are still able to make decisions for themselves or, only when they have lost capacity. The donor can also include instructions and preferences as to how they wish the power to operate in practice. The attorneys should assist the donor to make their own decisions as far as it is possible to do so. Just because the donor might make an unwise decision, it does not mean that they lack capacity. For example, someone might decide to spend f_{200} on a pair of sparkly shoes, this may seem unwise to some, but it does not mean that the donor lacks capacity and attorneys should support the donor as far as possible to make decisions for themselves.

Certificate Provider: Every power needs to be signed by someone who will

attest that the donor knows what they are signing i.e. they have mental capacity and appreciate the power they are giving to other people. They must also attest to the fact that the donor of the power is not being pressurised to enter into the power by anyone.

Who can act as Certificate Provider? Someone who has known you personally for two years or more, for example a trusted family friend, or someone with professional skills to act in that role, such as a doctor or a solicitor. Certain people cannot act as a certificate provider such as: a member of the donor's family, or a member of one of the attorney's family, owners or employees of the care home where the donor lives.

Attorneys: These should be people you trust implicitly as you are giving them tremendous authority to make decisions concerning the most important aspects of your life.

Who to choose to act as an attorney? Some people would decide to appoint their partner and children, but equally you could appoint friends or a professional such as a solicitor. It is essential to take into account whether your attorneys will work well together as well as the skills they have to act as your attorney. Key questions to ask yourself might be: do your attorneys make sensible decisions? Do they manage their own money well? Do you believe they will always make decisions in your best interests? You can decide to appoint your attorneys jointly so that every single decision must be made together, or you can appoint them 'jointly and severally' such that they can act together or independently. If appointed jointly and severally it may be more convenient for one attorney to make day to day decisions but they could come together with the other attorney for larger decisions. The attorneys will need to sign the power to say that they are happy to act as your attorney, however, it is a good idea to sit down with them first and explain the responsibility that you wish to give them.

People to notify: You have the option of notifying people (other than your certificate provider and attorneys) that you are applying to have the power registered in order that it can be used. It is purely optional whether the donor wishes to notify people but it does provide an additional safety check. The person the donor has chosen to notify can object to the registration of the power within a set amount of time if they think that the donor has been coerced to sign, or that they would not have understood what they have signed.

THE LAST WILD ORCHID OF THE YEAR

Towards the end of August, on the lawns of the Isle of Wight an inconspicuous species of wild orchid, the last British orchid of the season, appears for just a few weeks, heralding the end of the summer.

utumn Ladies-Tresses (Spiranthes spiralis) is the last of Britain's 56 species of wild orchid to come into flower in the year. From around the second week of August their thin pale green stems start to appear on garden lawns, grass verges, public recreation grounds, in open grassland, churches and cemeteries and on chalk downland.

By the end of August, three to twenty delicate white, bell like orchid flowers, appear from the middle of the stem upwards in a spiral resembling a ringlet hence the name Ladies-Tresses. When viewed close up through a hand lens the flowers and stems are covered in fine downy hairs giving them a charm all of their own.

The plants tiny stature (3-15cms) and small flowers mean that they are easily overlooked. In the last five years my partner and I have found the orchid on over 350 front lawns on the Isle of Wight although virtually none of the residents realised that they had them. Because of this they frequently succumb to the lawn mower.

Last year the wet weather in the middle of August meant that lots of residents on the Island cut their lawns towards the end of the month, so many of the lawns where the orchids were abundant in previous years, were sadly lacking this lovely



species. However, plants still survive even after they have been cut, and they will come up again the following year.

The flowers have a delicate sweet honey-vanilla scent, though smelling them involves getting very low to the ground and carefully cupping the flower spike in the hand to appreciate its aroma.

Autumn Ladies-Tresses is found throughout the Island, where the right habitats occur and although relatively common, it is almost certainly overlooked. It is abundant on the chalk of southern England, becoming less common the further north one goes.

As all orchid species in Britain are protected, it is against the law to pick them or dig them up without the permission of the owner of the land on which they are growing and they should be left for others to enjoy.

Individual plants are very long lived and may flower for many years and there may well be large numbers of

are able to flower. A cutting regime of last cut in the first week of August would allow the plants to flower and increase, while a further cut in late October would allow the orchids to set seed and colonies to expand further.

On the Island the species is particularly prevalent on lawns in parts of Bembridge, Binstead, Colwell, Cowes, Freshwater, Ryde, Sandown, Seaview, Totland and Wootton, but it could crop up almost anywhere especially on the chalk, so keep an eye out as you may well be lucky enough to have this delightful species on your lawn. ③

Is your garden looking tired and dusty? This month, Flo Whitaker recommends plants that revel in summer heat and will keep on looking good until autumn.

f you're bewilderedly wandering around the garden centre, searching for plants that won't shrivel in the heat, seek out those with light-reflective grey or silvery foliage as this usually indicates drought tolerance. Likewise, plants with tiny leaves, succulent or hairy foliage, are often better equipped for hot conditions. Small leaves have reduced surface areas - so less moisture loss. Succulent leaves mimic water reservoirs, while hairy foliage insulates from temperature extremes and also traps precious dew and moisture (a clever adaptation from desert environments).

Convolvulus cneorum is the perfect rockery plant; a compact, shrubby perennial with drought-busting silvery foliage and white funnel-shaped flowers. Convolvulus mauritanicus has periwinkle blue trumpet flowers and small grey/ green leaves that casually tumble over



walls or pot edges. It takes root wherever the stems touch the soil and, providing the soil is well-drained, is fully hardy.

Silver-leaved plants are ideal for seaside-themed or gravel gardens, as are many herbs, including rosemary, lavender, thyme and sage. Verbascum, artemisia, senecio, eryngium and shrubby nepeta, (Catmint) also enjoy full sun and free-draining soil. Verbenas are practically indestructible in heat. They are a large, diverse family; from low-growing bedding plants to stately verbena bonariensis that'll attain 2 metres.

If it's height you're after, annual forms of ipomoea will revel in sunshine and speedily reach 3 metres. Don't

panic - although related to 'Bindweed', these non-hardy characters won't set seed and rampage over your garden!

The Passiflora family, (Passion Flower) are vigorous perennials with astonishing blooms. Some forms won't survive outdoors in the UK and are more suited to conservatory life. Curb their thuggish tendencies by regularly removing excess growth and carefully choose the planting site as you'll need 'room to prune'. Campsis, (Trumpet Vine) is another borderline-hardy climber, but will usually

give campsis, the more it'll flower. Like under control.

cope outdoors in southern regions,

especially if grown against a sunny

wall. The more heat and light you can

adept at holding onto moisture and their bold seed heads give them a long season of interest. Don't believe the myth about keeping agapanthus starved and cramped in small pots - yes, they'll survive grim conditions, but will positively thrive when given space and nutritious compost.

For summer patio pots, try sunloving foliage plants such as variegated trailing nepeta,

dichondra 'Silver Falls' or furry-leaved helichrysum petiolare - and don't forget those old stalwarts; potted geraniums. Most varieties of bedding geraniums and pelargoniums are derived from indigenous South African forms. Heat and drought seldom trouble them, making them ideal candidates for hot conservatories. In fact, overwatering is what usually kills them off, so when an absent-minded friend forgets to do the watering while you're away, your pelargoniums will be perfectly content. 3
