BONFIRE mores

Indulge in S'mores around the bonfire this November.
Made traditionally in America with Graham Crackers, the British tend to use any thin biscuit they can get their hands on — Rich Tea or Nice biscuits make a great alternative.

INGREDIENTS

8 thin biscuits 4 squares of thin milk chocolate 8 marshmallows

METHOD

Sandwich two marshmallows and one square of chocolate between two biscuits and wrap tightly in tin foil.

2 Carefully warm the parcel over the bonfire, using tongs, or a cooking rack, for one to two minutes.

Carefully unfold and enjoy, being careful it's not too hot to burn your mouth.

If you're not having a bonfire this year, simply pop the parcels in the oven instead.



Stick to the main path which will take you on a circular route back to where you started. ③









For too long we have experienced this continual up and down shift of prices and supply and tariffs and everything else that, as consumers, drives us bonkers.

The reality of what we have and what's going on right now has been brewing for a long time. A perfect storm of situations, from Brexit to covid to the conflict in Russia, effectively means we are being throttled in our desire to heat and light our homes, ensure water comes through our taps and more.

You may say we have been unlucky to find these factors all colliding in together at one time, yet it is the job of the government – and any sort of decent opposition — to put fail safes in place so that when something catastrophic like this happens, the end result isn't the sort of bewildering increase in bills that really may move a greater quantity of people into poverty than we have ever seen before.

It's a disastrous combination and we are praying for short- and medium-term solutions that will see not just the most vulnerable through the winter, but everyone of huge inflation and cost of living emergency.

Let's just go to a basic summary of what we have here - in the UK we're talking about having privatised energy firms, but we effectively now have restricted competition and regulated prices in the form of a price cap. You have to ask yourself, what is the benefit of privatisation if you work in that marketplace?

You know, there's an argument for having nationalised energy firms and we run it that way; there's an argument for having market competition firms where we run it and we have differentials, and they compete to offer the best deal

And yet, what we now have is somewhere between the two. We have gloriously, in the middle of a cost of living crisis, managed to provide the worst of both sides!

All of the policies being put in place are trying to restrict future government liability, and I don't think we've done it the right way. I think we're doing it at the cost of consumers.

Efficiency: A newer woodburning fire or stove achieves an average efficiency of around 70 to 80%. Due to the lower temperature of an open fire, combustion is less complete. In a wood-

burning fire or stove, a higher temperature is achieved, and combustion is cleaner and

more efficient.

You DON'T need a chimney: If you live in a house without a chimney, you may be wondering whether it is possible to have a wood burning or pellet stove. Fortunately for many, the answer is a resounding yes! Luckily for those living in modern homes, you do not need a chimney to install a wood burning or pellet stove... You could have a Twin Wall Flue system installed. I live in a smoke free zone: Many contemporary

wood burners are so clean

burning, that they can be installed in a smoke free zone. Some towns and cities have what is called a Smoke Controlled Zone. Smoke controlled areas were introduced as part of the Clean Air Act. This means in certain parts of the country, you're not allowed to burn some fuels that can cause smoke

It's considered "carbon-neutral," which means when it burns, it doesn't add additional carbon dioxide to the environment. This is because in its natural state as a tree, wood absorbs carbon dioxide that's in the atmosphere. During combustion, a balance is maintained.

t all started in 1972. when Alfred Wells and two of his sons, Alistair and John, started a small engineering business in Niton.

Since then, AJ Wells & Sons, the company behind the manufacture of Charnwood Stoves, has grown from its original small factory of around 1,500 sq. ft to its current site of over 50,000sq.

Under the name AJ Wells & Sons, it has also become a major player in transport signage. In 1990, a vitreous enamel plant was installed, allowing the stoves to be enamelled in-house, giving birth to AJ Wells Vitreous Enamellers. This began a relationship with Transport For London, with AJ Wells becoming the principal supplier of signage for the London Underground.

The workforce has risen from the original team of three to well over 150 — many staff having worked with the company for more than 25 years.


Founder, John Wells said: "As I look at the company now, one of the longest established British stove manufacturers selling fires to all corners of the globe I can't help thinking that this certainly wasn't part of our vision when we started back in February 1972. The main aim then was to make enough money to enable us to eat and pay the mortgage. In one sense it hasn't


TEEN EPILEPSY CAFÉ OPENS

The flights took place on Sunday 4th September from Sandown Airport - who generously helped by agreeing to waiver their airport landing fees for the competition flights. The two winning youngsters were accompanied by their mums - although they were given the option of choosing their favourite teachers.

The Isle of Wight's St Mary's Hospital is to get a £23 million upgrade, which will see a new Emergency Care Floor created, a new mental health hub and wards reconfigured.

The investment, which forms part of a £48 million programme, has been described as "once in a generation" by the Isle of Wiaht NHS Trust.

Building work starts this month. Part of plans will see a new High Dependency Unit established in the hope of improving the flow of patients.

A new £6.7 million mental health and community hub will also be built in Newport. The trust has said this will bring health and care services much closer to people's homes.

It's hoped the upgrade works will help to reduce waiting times and bed occupancy, and to transform community mental health provision on the Island.

Funding has been drawn up as part of the Trust's Investing in Our Future (IOF) programme and has been approved by the Department of Health and Social Care and NHS England.

Included in the IOF programme is a

£12.5m investment in digital infrastructure and technology, currently awaiting regulatory approval.

IOF launched following a UK Government announcement of £48m million to improve NHS services through investment in infrastructure.

The Island's NHS is also set to welcome further investment

after Government announced one of the 10 new Community Diagnostic Centres (CDC) will be built on the St Mary's site.

The centre will mean greater access to diagnostic tests for Islanders, reducing waiting times and improving outcomes.



NHS Continuing Care

When should a person be assessed?

HS Continuing Healthcare (CHC) is an NHS-funded package of ongoing care. To qualify for NHS CHC funding, an individual must have ongoing significant physical and/or mental health needs, and, having taken account of those needs, it can be said that the main aspects or majority part of the care you need is focused on addressing and/or preventing health needs.

It is not enough to have a social need (things like practical activities, personal care and making sure a person is safe), a person must also have a health need to qualify.

Initially an individual is assessed by a heath care professional using a government CHC checklist. This then confirms whether a person is eligible for a full continuing care assessment.

The full assessment is then completed by a multidisciplinary team (MDT) made up of a minimum of two professionals from different healthcare professions. The MDT should usually include both health and social care professionals who are already involved in your care. You, as the person being assessed, should know and be involved in that assessment.

WHEN SHOULD A CHC CHECKLIST BE COMPLETED?

In a hospital setting a CHC checklist should automatically be completed when an individual is ready for discharge from hospital prior to a local authority funding assessment or, as was happening during COVID, shortly after discharge.

If a person is moving into residential care from a home setting then you can request that a checklist is completed prior to that move. GPs, nurses and social workers should be able to complete this checklist at any time.

You can also request further CHC checklists if your health deteriorates after having an initial assessment.

You should be told when it is being completed and you should always be involved in the assessment.

WHY HAVEN'T I HEARD ABOUT THIS BEFORE?

Research by the Continuing Healthcare Alliance (a group of 13 organisations who believe NHS continuing healthcare needs to improve) shows that 60% of people they surveyed did not know about this funding until very late in their dealings with social and health care services.

Checklists don't always appear to be completed and, if they are, people are not informed of the outcome meaning they don't have the ability to appeal the decisions made within them.

We also recommend that you seek legal advice before your loved one is discharged from hospital or on going into residential care so that you can make sure that procedures are followed and all avenues for funding are explored. ③



MAIN BUILDING **FACILITIES**

A welcoming community atmosphere is at the heart of the Green Meadows Development and is the focus of many of the facilities providing supported, settled and safe living for all residents.

The ground floor of the building is where many of the facilities are located including an activities room, communal lounge, dining room and tea & coffee making facilities. There is also a communal washing & drying room, mobility scooter store with charging points, activities & lunch club, hairdressers and a shop run by residents. Also, a minibus takes residents to different locations each week. Available apartments are situated on the first, second and third floor with lift access to all floors as well as stairs.

Assisted bathrooms are available if needed. These are situated throughout the building. There are also guest suites if visitors wish to stay overnight and prefer to have their own suite rather than staying in an apartment, these can be reserved at a small cost.

The building and all apartments are wheelchair accessible and the wellbeing team are registered with the Care Quality Commission and the service is delivered to meet all regulatory requirements with all staff trained to a high standard and hold the necessary background checks.

RECEPTION

Located as you enter the

building is a small seating area with communal hot drink facilities, communal disabled WCs, scheme shop, hairdressers and mobility scooter storage. The reception desk supports residents and visitors when required.

TWO-BEDROOM **APARTMENTS ENTRANCE HALL**

Upon entering the apartments there is a spacious entrance hall with storage and access to the bathroom, both bedrooms and to the kitchen/lounge.

KITCHEN/LOUNGE

A pull cord is situated next to the WC, there is a touch light mirrored cabinet over basin and a heated towel rail.

17'9" x 9'6" (5.4m x 2.9m) A spacious double room with shower room access and plenty of room for drawers and or a wardrobe.

BEDROOM 2


