In this insightful radio interview with Dr Abdoulie

The visionary behind the BBAM! Festival, several pivotal points emerged. First and foremost, the genesis of this festival was rooted in addressing inequalities. Dr Abdoulie passionately expressed that Black businesses and talents often remain in the shadows due to resource and opportunity constraints.

A standout feature of this conversation was the revelation that this marks the very first BBAM! Festival in Southampton. It's a monumental event not only for the Black community but for all, transcending ethnicity as it showcases a rich tapestry of talents.

The over arching goals of this festival are crystal clear: increase exposure for Black businesses. boost their confidence, and cultivate interconnected networks among



Black businesses and artists. Dr Abdoulie also shed light on the issues of confidence and resource accessibility. Confidence, he explained, can be eroded by the perception that Black businesses can't compete in the larger market. Furthermore, access to loans and investments remains a challenge due to perceived racial bias and a lack of trust in financial institutions.

Ultimately, this interview illuminated the BBAM! Festival's vital role in surmounting these challenges. bolstering the confidence of Black businesses and artists, and furnishing them with a vibrant platform to flourish and forge meaningful connections with their communities.

The birth of TUVAA was a milestone achievement for our individual African societies. Through TUVAA, the African member associations forged a unity of purpose and enhanced the promotion of our collective interests, our diverse cultures, customs, and values.







SAY IT LOUD

Scar Fm (Sayitloud Radio) is a black internet community radio station based in Southampton formed in late 2020.

The Station traces its early roots from the 90s, where a collection of individuals from the black community Jimi Jon ,Scratch Gordon and Keith Richards set up PCRS (People's choice radio station) broadcasting live but underground where it gained thousands of followers in Southampton until its demise in 1991.

However, it slowly returned through the 90s and again 2003/2004 when many of its hosts featured on Unity24 (Now unity 101)

In 2020 Jimi Jon, Sal Chitulu, Scratch Gordon and TC from MAKA foundation revived the brand as an internet radio station.

The station will provide a broadcast service that informs, entertains and actively represents and promotes the black heritage, culture, traditions, music and artists, acting as an agent of cohesion through which all black and other communities in Southampton can unite and flourish.

We aim to create a medium through which communities in Southampton and the surrounding areas, can express their views and opinions, whilst keeping in touch with their culture and roots.

"We aim to be the local radio sound, made and presented by local people" We will be dedicated to representing the many underserved members or groups within our city that do not get access to the airwaves via a vibrant and black led schedule of music, speech and creative programming. The station will encourage constructive partnerships with similar organisations.

The station will aim to work with the community and voluntary sectors to promote and communicate their activities within the wider community including peer education projects.
